Jesus once said:




"Do you suppose that I came to give peace on earth? I tell you, not at all, but rather division. From now on five in one house will be divided:

Father against son, and son against father;
mother against daughter, and daughter
against mother.”*

Luke 12:51-53

We're divided over faith versus works, pre-tribulation or post-tribulation, creation timelines, the role of Israel... and so much more.




Yet if we are truly entering the challenging days of the End Times, one thing is clear: division weakens us. Unity strengthens us.




When asked about the greatest commandment, He said:

Matthew 22:37-40




Paul also warned us not to
