


*From Abraham to Eternity*

of the earth shall be blessed.*



# THE SEED — OF — ABRAHAM


This promise pointed to one seed, Jesus Christ, the true Seed of Abraham, through whom salvation would reach every nation.

Galatians 3:16




Israel was chosen to be God's *kingdom of priests and a holy nation*. They were called to be a light to the world, showing God's love even to foreigners.

Exodus 19:6




But instead, the Old Testament records a cycle of rebellion, idolatry, and rejection of God's covenant.




In the end, God's promise to Abraham will be complete: Through Jesus Christ, every tribe, tongue, and nation will be redeemed.
