of the earth shall be blessed.*



This promise pointed to one seed, Jesus Christ, the true Seed of Abraham, through whom salvation would reach every nation.


Galatians 3:16



Israel was chosen to be God's *kingdom of priests and a holy nation*. They were called to be a light to the world, showing God's love even to foreigners.






Prophets like


Yet God also promised
