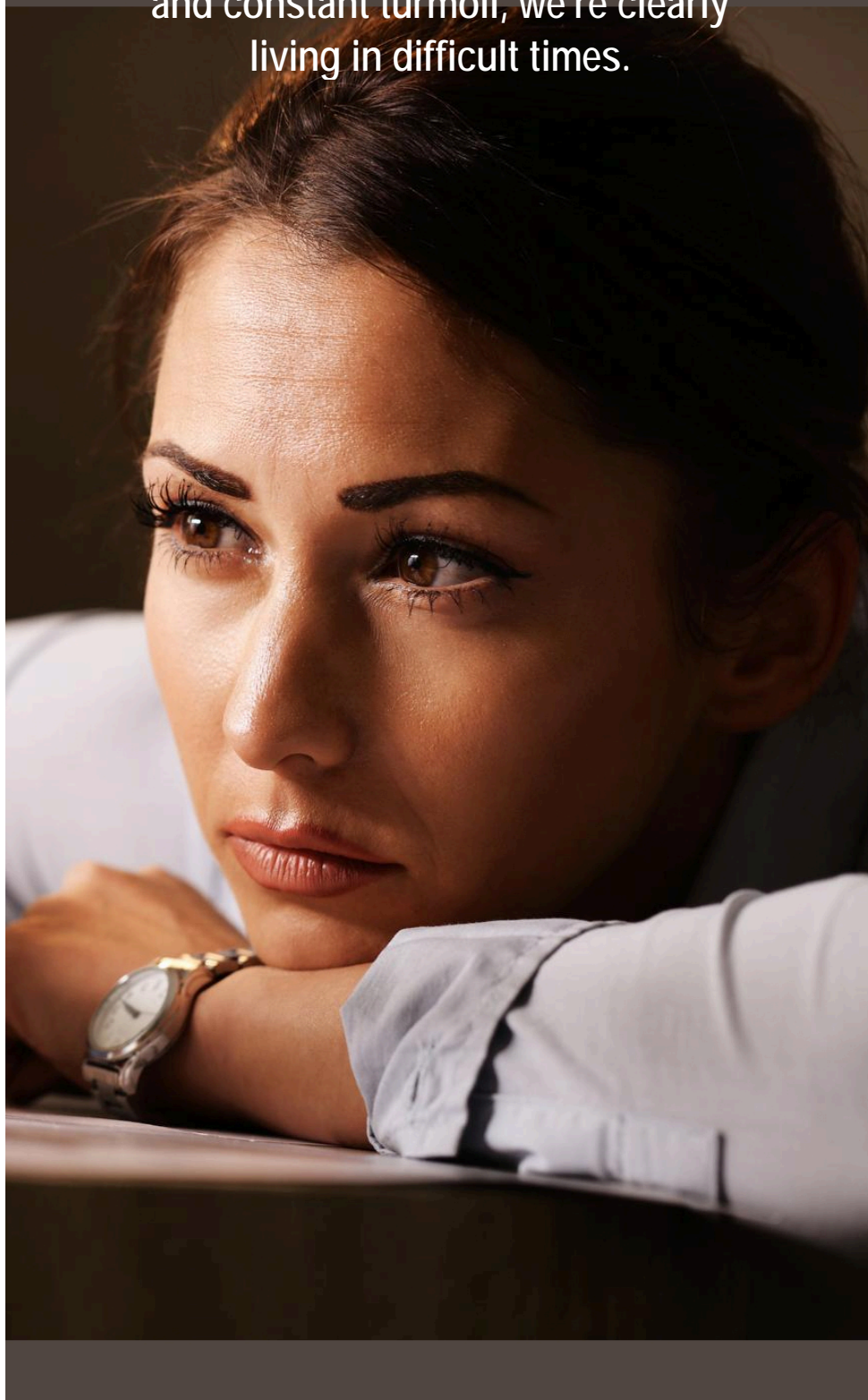


Not of This World !

Despite living under Roman tyranny—one of history's worst oppressive regimes—Jesus never took political sides.

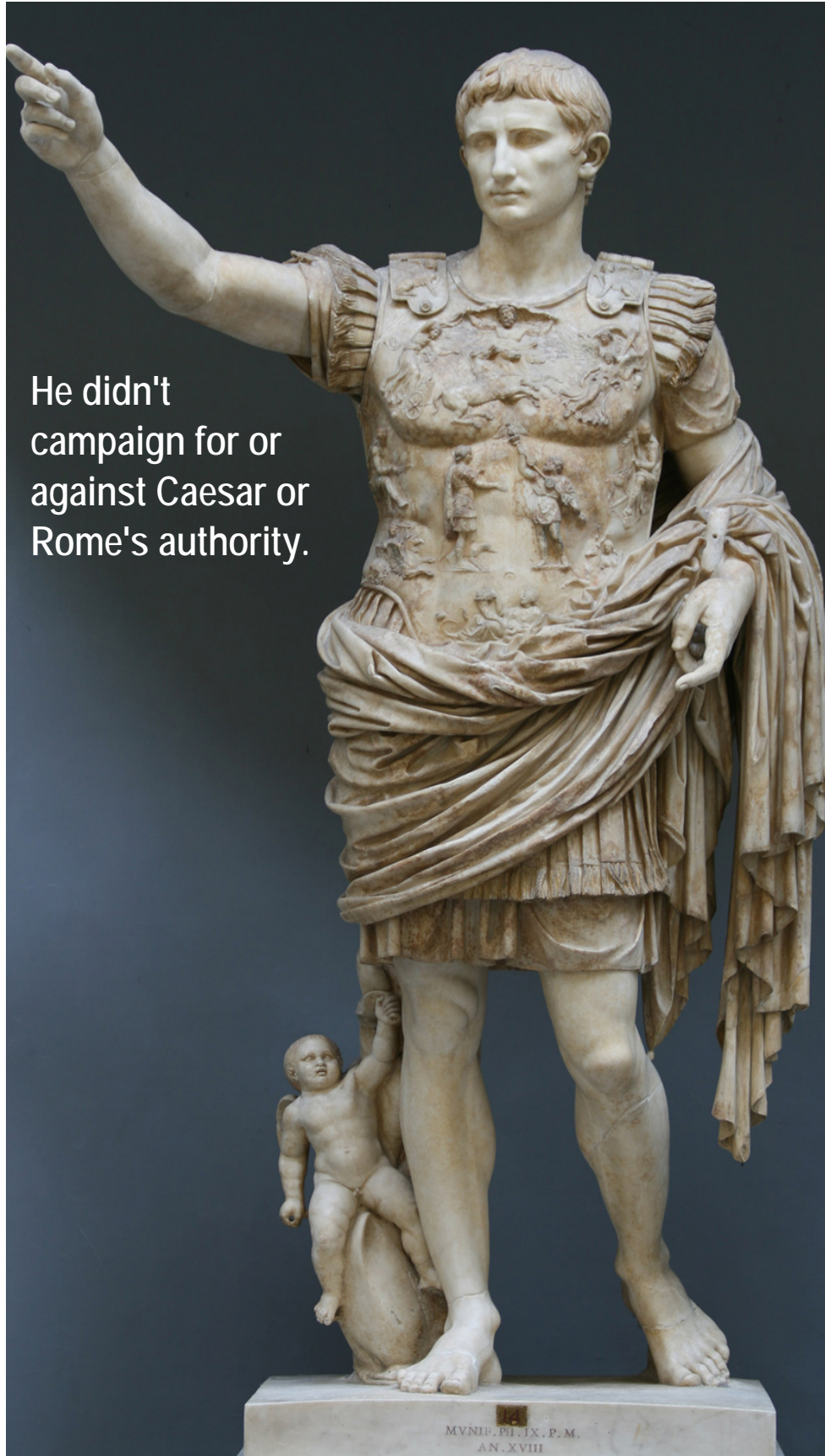


He once said: *"Render unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's."*

Matthew 22:21




He didn't


