Could it be a fulfillment of what the prophet Daniel foretold that *"in the time of the end, knowledge shall be increased"* (Daniel 12:4)?




Today we face new "trees" that promise answers to every question and solutions to every problem.

The first humans were warned not to eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, yet the temptation was too strong.





... we find ourselves back in the garden, reaching for the wrong tree.




Use your tools, but worship God.
